But COVID is still here, so we remained careful, with masks, frequent hand washing and physically distancing. Numbers at our Family Camp was significantly lower than previous years but we were so happy to be back at Five Oaks, after missing Family Camp for two years.




Bread and Bricks continued to meet 1-3pm Thursdays, Beyond Table 91 met on the 3rd Wednesday of the month. The city's Community Crisis Response Program funded two community projects, one adultinitiated, "Just Breathe," and one youth-initiated, "Safety in Pelham." Other projects and events were shared at this table, including a Sage Planting Ceremony with Sarah Campbell from Toronto Urban Native Ministry offering prayers and sage seeds. The hope is to have an understanding of food sovereignty. Dovetailing this are discussions on community land trusts, in much the same way as the Black Farmers Collective were able to get land to produce food. In 2023, we hope to educate the community and gathering support locally and broadly for a Community Land Trust at Gete-Onigaming.

Our Canada Summer Jobs participants, Renee Carelse-Turner, Travell Brown and Maxim Phan reframed the 2021 storytelling project to reflect on how COVID-19 affected our community members. We learned three things: that people want to be seen, acknowledged and to be heard; that hunger for human connection is more powerful than the hunger for material things and that everyone desires to reach out and help for the common good.

We are grateful for community members, for friends, too many to mention here, as Vincenzo Pietropaolo, who said in his photography workshop that every picture tells a story, or Goh Iromoto, who moved us to tell our stories in a way that can move ourselves and others to seeing the world differently in his video workshop.

In accompaniment, DPCM affirms the light and gifts in every person, being with them in joy and in grief, leading in prayers, in memorials, in vigils. Chi-miigwech!
